

INNSBRUCK, AUSTRIA

With a population of about 130,000 inhabitants, Innsbruck is located in the "heart of the Alps". The city is surrounded by high peaks – the "Nordkette" (part of the Karwendelgebirge) in the north and the mountains "Patscherkofel" and "Serles" in the south. The name Innsbruck is derived from the river Inn and the antique word "bruck" and means "the bridge over the river Inn". The most important sight is the Golden Roof ("Goldenes Dachl"), the city's landmark located in the Old Town ("Altstadt").

About 28.000 students are enrolled in the University of Innsbruck, the Innsbruck Medical University and the Management Center Innsbruck.


Innsbruck is an ideal place to do all kinds of sports in winter as well as in summer: The numerous ski resorts being situated close to the capital attract locals as well as tourists. Also one can do alpine touring, cross-country-skiing, sledding and ice skating during winter time. In the summer Innsbruck and its surroundings are a paradise for hikers, climbers, mountain bikers and golfers.

There are several cultural events taking place throughout the year, such as "Tanzsommer", "Festwochen der Alten Musik", "Bergsilvester", performances in the theaters "Landestheater", "Kammerspiele" – just to name a few.

Due to the historical ambience of the city and the numerous sporting facilities Innsbruck is a center of attraction for tourists.

Application Times

Please note that you have to apply to the exchange programme in your current year by 20 December. Applications for the host university must be submitted between April and May or September and October (depending on the Trimester), in the year following your initial application.

ACCOMODATION & LIVING



OeAD arranges rooms in student dormitories for a small monthly fee. This is the easiest and most convenient way for exchange students to find relatively inexpensive housing.

MCI cooperates with the dormitory **Internationales Studentenhaus (ISH)**. Exchange students can also book a room at ISH via MCI. Students may also apply for a room directly at one of Innsbruck's numerous dormitories.

Finding private accommodation in Innsbruck is not always easy, especially at the beginning of a new semester. Nevertheless, students who are willing to invest considerable effort may be able to find a room in a shared apartment or a studio.

Living Costs

Housing including utilities (single room; studio) €300 – €700/month

Food and drinks €300 – €400/month

Public transportation (based on IVB semester ticket) €22/month

Personal care €20/month

Cell phone €30/month

Internet, if not included in rent €20 – €50/month

Other (books, leisure activities, trips, etc.) €100 – €300/month


Transport

Innsbruck is a relatively small city and very walkable. Depending on where you live, a bike might still come in handy. You can find used bikes at flea markets, online, in bike stores, or in the local press.

Innsbruck's around-the-clock bus and tram network extends to almost all parts of the city. If you plan on taking the bus or tram regularly, the semester ticket for students offered by the local public transportation service IVB might be a good option for you. IVB also offers a useful timetable app for smartphones.

Based in Innsbruck, students can easily travel to other beautiful European cities. **The Austrian Federal Railway (ÖBB)** offers discount passes for all age groups. If you are under 26, you will get the **Vorteilscard** for as little as EUR 20. This card entitles you to a 50% discount within Austria and a 25% discount outside Austria.


