the curriculum). You may therefore enrol in an intensive German course in your first year and postpone the theory classes until your second year of study.

## 2.1. Visa and entry requirements

Citizens from the **EU and EEA member states** (including Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway) and Switzerland do not require visa to travel to Austria.

**Non EU or EEA citizens** need a visa for entering Austria. Students must arrange for their visa on their own. Please inform yourself about entry and visa regulations to Austria well in advance at the Austrian Embassy in your home country.

# Citizen of EU/EEA countries & Switzerland:

If you are going to stay in Austria for more than 3 months you have to obtain a "Confirmation of registration (Anmeldebescheinigung)" within 4 months of entering Austria.

For the **Confirmation of registration** you need the following documents:

- completed and signed application form
- valid identity card or passport
- proof of a health insurance covering all the necessary costs, e.g. European Health Insurance Card, insurance policy,...(coverage at least 30 000 €)
- proof of sufficient finances, e.g. by means of savings or a bank account, traveller's cheques,...
- confirmation of admission by the university

## 2.2. Insurance

You need valid health insurance throughout your stay in Austria.

Students from EU countries, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway and Switzerland can obtain a European Health Insurance Card that gives you access to medically necessary, state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay in any of the 28 EU countries, under the same conditions and at the same cost (free in some countries) as people insured in that country.

## 3. St. Pölten

#### 3.1. Introduction

St. Pölten is not only the oldest town in Austria, but also the capital city of Lower Austria. The long history of St. Pölten is reflected in the unique structure of the city. Many buildings in Baroque and Art Nouveau style characterise the old town and refer to the magnificent architecture of centuries long gone by. However, great present-day architects have also provided the city with modern buildings perfectly fitted into the townscape. This means that there is no strict separation between the present and the past. The city stretches to about 108.48 km² with 52.145 inhabitants. It lies on the Traisen river. Located north of the Alps and south of the Wachau and is part of the Mostviertel, the southwestern region of Lower Austria. St. Pölten is 66 km apart from Vienna.

The culture and leisure time program in St. Pölten is very diverse and there are plenty of possibilities to discover the town every time anew. The FM4 Frequency Festival, known all around the world, takes place once a year in Austria and attracts high-class international artists.

St. Pölten perfectly combines the old cultural city with modern lifestyle. Modern buildings in the Landhausviertel district perfectly blend in the historic picture of the old town. Concerts, festivals and other cultural offers ensure that there is something for everyone. Many guests also find the State Museum of Lower Austria particularly interesting as it shows art, culture and nature alike. In summer, St. Pölten offers leisure time pleasures with the Viehofner lake and Ratzersdorfer lake in the middle of the city. Furthermore, there are sports facilities available for a relaxing day in the water. The clear waters are not only a pleasure for people, but also for rare birds as they regularly hatch at the shores of the lakes — this is a sign for the intact nature in this area.


# 3.3.2. How to get to the NDU

## If you live in St. Pölten:

Within St. Pölten you can use the LUP city bus. Please find out more about the <u>price and the schedule</u>. The tickets are available at the City Hall.

If you plan to frequently go to Vienna, you can purchase a reduced monthly ticket for  $83,30 \in$  for which you need a confirmation of enrolment and a customer card from the Austrian Railways (ÖBB Vorteilscard Jugend) for the price of  $19 \in$ ).

For using the means of public transport in Vienna you can buy a semester ticket (valid from September to January for the winter term or from February to June for the summer term) for the price of 150 €.

#### If you live in Vienna

If you live in Vienna you can purchase a semester ticket for the reduced price of 75 € which is valid within Vienna.

For going from Vienna to St. Pölten there is a reduced monthly ticket for 83,30 €.
