

Throughout its short and exciting history, Vytautas Magnus University (VMU) has been faithfully nurturing its distinguished traditions. What sets this university apart is its willingness to organize studies, scientific research, and life of the community in a different way. Intellectuals from Lithuania and abroad participated in the reestablishment of VMU and defined its goals, which remain unchanged today. At VMU, the forerunning principles are liberal and democratic and importance is placed on aesthetics, honesty, tolerance, and the ability to think independently. Through these ideals, creativity, progress and the development of national culture are all brought into sharp focus.

From the very first days of the university's re-establishment in 1989, the experiences of Western universities have been an important influence. Based on the model of universities like Harvard, VMU implemented a more modern approach to studies. In that respect, VMU differs from other Lithuanian universities in the freedom it gives students to choose and design their own study schedule, while also being the first Lithuanian institution of higher education to offer bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree studies.

The VMU community - students, lecturers, graduates - is united in the idea of *artes liberals* – the classical university of liberal arts. With this as a base, warm, honest interaction and liberal humanist spirit follows and provides strength to the community.

Classical liberal arts universities are the labs of modern life, educating bold young people who are not afraid to experiment and are on their way to becoming professional contributors to the future. A classical university is not governed by pragmatic matters. Formulas do not apply here. This is the space for young people to become more open-minded and develop critical thinking skills, attributes which will stay with them for a lifetime.

At Vytautas Magnus University, one of our most distinguishing features is a general, wide-ranging university education, which not only rewards the graduates with bachelor's or master's degrees, but also creates active and engaged members of society who are able to think independently and creatively. VMU alumni understand the benefit of continuing to learn and grow for their entire lives.

Local and international students have the opportunity to avail themselves of courses in more than 30 modern and classic languages, ranging from Ancient and Modern Greek to Turkish along with others, including Arabic, Catalan, Chinese, Danish, English, Estonian, Finnish, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Latin, Latvian,

innovative research

Since 1989, the researchers of Vytautas Magnus University have accumulated solid experience in international scientific research and project management. They hold memberships in national and international associations of diverse scientific fields. Publications within the scientific presses of Lithuania and elsewhere are announced frequently.

The main strength of research at VMU is its ability to be flexible when responding to rapidly changing research

fields and modes, which leads to the formation of new priorities, the emergence of relevant research topics, and the challenges of national and international programmes. Recently, VMU has been involved in various FP6, FP7, Horizon 2020, diverse COST and Erasmus+ activities, among others, as well as national ESF projects as project partner and coordinator.

Research priorities

Seeking to integrate research from a variety of fields, research at the university is performed by clusters, (i.e. groups of researchers and research centres). One of the objectives of VMU's "cluster strategy" is to rally groups of researchers, specifically in the priority fields of art and science, by developing and creating science/arts clusters and promoting interdisciplinary, inter-field, and inter-institutional research as well as artistic activities, which will engage young research fellows and artists.

Competence of the researchers

VMU researchers and teachers are highly qualified professionals whose competence has been recognized on both national and international levels, with memberships in the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences, the Science Council of Lithuania, and various international organisations. You will find our colleagues working as experts in their fields and on the commissions of numerous competitions. The achievements of VMU researchers have also been honoured with a diverse array of prizes and scholarships – not to mention being awarded honorary titles by foreign universities.

At the national level, the potential of VMU research has received the highest evaluation scores among higher education institutions of Lithuania. VMU is a leading university in the fields of Humanities, Arts, and Social and Biomedical Sciences (MOSTA 2015).

doctoral studies

Vytautas Magnus University has a distinct advantage when it comes to its young, promising doctoral students. PhD studies at VMU open up unique possibilities for academic research and studies, which contribute to the development of future generations of highly qualified specialists. Graduates of doctoral studies at VMU are capable of conducting internationally recognized, independent scientific research and advancing experimental (social, cultural) development, not to mention solving hot-button issues of interest to Lithuanian, European and global science.

Fields of Study

Doctoral studies are provided jointly with 23 partner institutions in Lithuania and abroad. VMU is the leader in 15 doctoral consortiums and a partner/participant in 3 additional consortiums.

Currently, Vytautas Magnus University offers doctoral studies in 4 science areas and 18 scientific fields:


- Biomedical sciences: Biophysics, Biology, Ecology and Environmental Science;

the faculty of arts

The Faculty of Arts offers unique integrated studies of the Theory and History of Art, as well as innovative programmes of New Media Art, Acting and Creative Industries. Bachelors of Arts and Humanities Degrees are conferred by the Departments of Art History and Criticism, Theatre Studies, and Contemporary Arts. Additionally, continuing students can earn master's degrees in theatre studies and performing arts management, art history and critique, art curating, and be noted as experts of cultural heritage and creative industries. The faculty also offers two international bachelor degree programs organized jointly with the University of Central Lancashire (UCLan, United Kingdom) – Fashion Design and Music Production. Studies in Faculty of Arts take place not only in lecture rooms but also in art laboratories and workshops, libraries, museums, theatres, cinemas and concert halls, all of which serve as venuesfor the examination of art objects and creative practices. For practical work, students will find media, sound, photography and video work rooms and laboratories, all of which are kept at the highest technological standards. Lectures in the faculty are read by working artists and experts in their fields.

The VMU Theatre is the first and only professional university theatre in Lithuania, providing a new theatrical space, dedicated to joint projects by prominent and promising young artists from Lithuania and abroad.



the faculty of catholic theology

The Faculty of Catholic Theology is the only Lithuanian faculty approved by the Apostolic Congregation for Catholic Education in the Vatican for awarding not just civil but ecclesiastical degrees as well. While the studies here are attractive to future priests, the laity is also enthusiastically invited. The faculty welcomes any students who hold Christian values or plan on working in a church or public organization, solving socially relevant issues of morality, spirituality, and ethics, while responding to the fundamental needs of person, family, and society. In the Faculty of Catholic Theology, exceptional attention is given to community life and the students' pastoral care. Students are provided with opportunities to work as volunteers with Catholic organizations, youth and family centres, initiatives of New Evangelization, and the radio station "Radio Maria", among others. Various conferences, courses ("Alfa", "Know Yourself") and seminars are an excellent setting for the students to discuss religion and life and look for ample solutions to relevant problems.




the faculty of economics and management

The VMU Faculty of Economics and Management is one of the most internationally acclaimed schools of its type, recently ranked among the top 10% of business schools in the world. The international network of higher education schools, EDUNIVERSAL, carries out annual assessments of 7,000 business schools around the globe and in 2015, the VMU Faculty of Economics and Management received 3 Palmes of Excellence and a solid ranking of "Excellent", recognizing its high level of influence.

The Faculty of Economics and Management organises studies in the fields of Economics, Business Administration, Finance, and Marketing. Double Degree opportunities are offered with prestigious universities such as the University of Trento (Italy), the University of Aveiro (Portugal), the Norwegian School of Economics (NHH) (Norway), and the Universite Catholique de Louvain (Belgium). Master programmes in Marketing and Sales, and Marketing and International Commerce were rated in the top 20 master degree studies in Eastern Europe by EDUNIVERSAL.

Well-qualified faculty teachers contribute to the evolving responsibility, diligence, self-reliance and communicability of future graduates and student internships are given high priority at the faculty. Successful careers of the alumni at various Lithuanian and International business organizations, local branches of foreign companies, and governmental institutions serve as a testament that the studies offer enough universal and specialized knowledge to help students successfully integrate into the competitive world of business.





the faculty of humanities

The humanities at Vytautas Magnus University are especially important, because, aside from high quality education, they also provide the student with the ability to explore and understand the world around us, use independent and critical thinking and develop an original and creative personality.

The faculty offers the following studies of the humanities: history, Lithuanian, English, German, French philology, as well as Italian studies and Romance languages, Scandinavian, East Asian cultures and languages. These programmes can be selected as the major track at BA, MA and PhD level studies. Every semester, various study subjects are taught by guest lecturers from all around the world. What is more, the faculty offers international jointdegree study program Sociolinguistics and Multilingualism organised with Johannes-Gutenberg University (Germany), Stockholm University (Sweden), and the University of Tartu (Estonia) that provide students with the opportunity to acquire knowledge on certain European regions and the importance of multilingual and intercultural competences.

The driving force of the faculty's scientific research is in the research clusters and research centres of: Computational Linguistics, Culture Research, Prof. Bronius Vaškelis' Literary Comparativistics, Kaunas' History, Intercultural Communication and Multilingualism, Lithuanian Emigration Institute, Centre For Asian Studies.



the faculty of informatics

Looking to adapt students to the needs of modern society, The Faculty of Informatics offers both BSc and MSc degree study programmes. In addition to gaining up to date knowledge of informatics and mathematics, the students also learn to apply it while working towards business management solutions, designing services for users of modern networks, and creating virtual communities. Even more esoteric concepts, like language/text and sound/music analysis, computer imaging or even attempting to imitate the thought process itself, can also be explored. Dedicated, modern research labs are available for student use. In order to help facilitate studies and individual research, students can gain access to Computer Controlled Systems, Audio-visual Technology, 3D modelling, Virtual Environments, and Neuroscience labs (run jointly with the Faculty of Natural Sciences), as well as the centres of Computer Linguistics and Energetic Security Research, amongst others.

Laboratories are equipped with process modelling equipment, industrial controllers, 3D design and prototyping hardware and software, and sound and motion capture equipment with corresponding software. Data mining, as well as text and speech processing research, is done using server resources from the university's Private Cloud of Computational Resources.





the faculty of law

Legal studies at VMU were prepared according to the model of Western universities. This model was chosen due to the demand for highly qualified lawyers who would possess a wide, liberal education, fluency in legal English and the ability to work both in Lithuania and abroad. Currently, the faculty provides both bachelor's and master's studies of law, as well as an integrated study programme. Integrated studies encompass the complete bachelor's and master's level studies. Upon completion, the degree of Master of Law and the professional qualification of lawyer are awarded.

Students of the Faculty of Law have the opportunity to get the Michigan State University Certificate in Transnational Law in addition to their VMU master's degree diploma. The certificate testifies that the faculty's alumnus has passed the main courses of international law and has a good command of legal English. VMU is the first university in Lithuania, and one of the few in Europe, to have signed an agreement of this kind with one of the most prestigious universities in the USA.

The Faculty of Law is unique in Lithuania due to its exceptional teaching methods, which promote the Socratic Method during lectures. Rather than having the teacher speak and the students take notes, an unconventional approach, practiced in the most prestigious American universities, is taken. During discussions and practical activities, the students analyse specific cases where legal regulations are applied and solve exercises of law by applying a Question & Answer format. Well qualified scientists and specialists of their fields (civil, criminal, administrative law and other legal areas) are teaching at the faculty, ensuring that the knowledge and skills required by professionally practicing lawyers are imparted to the students.


the music academy

VMU Music Academy is a constantly changing, dynamic part of the university, where the best traditions of music education (mastery of the performing arts, lecturers sharing their professional experience directly, and teaching a particular specialty in a consistent manner) are balanced with a broad, general university education (studies of languages, the humanities and social sciences), helping to educate an individual who is intellectual and creative.

Students in the music academy focus on one of the following specializations: piano, strings (guitar, alto, double-bass, violin, cello), brass and woodwind (bassoon, flute, clarinet, oboe, saxophone, French horn,

trumpet, baritone, trombone, tuba), percussion and jazz (bass guitar, singing, flute, piano, guitar, clarinet, percussion, saxophone, trumpet, trombone), stage genre singing, accompaniment, chamber ensemble (strings, woodwind, brass, piano and percussion), concert genre singing, or conducting.

The VMU Music Academy collaborates with the prestigious Juilliard School, which nurtures its traditions of musical education with the highest level of mastery and the latest interpretative pursuits. VMU's Music Academy is the first partner of the Juilliard School in Eastern Europe.





the faculty of natural sciences

The Faculty of Natural Sciences is a modern centre of study and research. As the attention to biology, biochemistry, biotechnology, environmental protection, ecology, alternative energy sources, climate change and other issues keeps growing worldwide, the popularity of these study programmes has also grown.

Students undertake research not only in the modern labs at VMU, but in the research centres of other Lithuanian scientific and educational institutions as well. Postgraduate and doctoral students become integral in contributing to the research projects carried out by their professors and the department.

Laboratories include: Microsynthesis laboratories, HPLC and UPLC, Laboratory of gas-chromatograph, Capillary electrophoresis laboratory, Laboratory for sample preparation, Microbiology lab, Miniaturised bioreaction, Biocromatography, Mass spectrometry, Spectrophotometry lab.





the faculty of political science and diplomacy

The Faculty of Political Science and Diplomacy at VMU is the leading Lithuanian centre for studies and research of political science, political philosophy, public administration, public communications, journalism, and regional studies. It offers modern international programmes of an interdisciplinary character that have proven to be popular among both local and foreign students.

Just like other divisions of VMU, this faculty nurtures the ideals of liberal arts, while its departments and centres maintain close collaborations. This leads to effective organization of studies, seminars, conferences and interdisciplinary scientific and applied research projects. The Faculty of Political Science and Diplomacy is also involved in the implementation of the Interdisciplinary Master's in East European Research and Studies (MIREES), a study programme launched in cooperation with three other European universities University of Bologna (Italy), St. Petersburg State vUniversity (Russian Federation) and Corvinus University of Budapest (Hungary).

The lectures at the faculty are taught not only by local and visiting professors, but also by diplomats from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, heads of Lithuanian representations abroad, members of the European and Lithuanian Parliaments, specialists from various ministries, journalists, public organization leaders, and other experts.





the faculty of social sciences

In the Faculty of Social Sciences at Vytautas Magnus University, we focus on research and studies of the nature, behaviour and development of the individual, community and society.

The faculty offers unique opportunities for international, European, and transatlantic studies and research. A joint doctoral degree programme in Education has been established with the University of Aveiro (Portugal). Students working towards a Master's in Social Anthropology also obtain an Anthropology certificate from Southern Illinois University (USA) through another joint programme, while students in social work obtain an attendance certificate from Loyola University Chicago (USA). Our "International Journal of Psychology: a Biopsychosocial approach", is published in collaboration with the University of Nebraska at Kearney (USA).

The studies are enriched through a thought-provoking academic life. Students are encouraged to express themselves and show initiative within student organizations and at various events, all while contributing to the management of the faculty through academic discussions and even have a say in departmental decision making.

Vytautas Magnus University has focused on international cooperation since the beginning of its re-establishment by Lithuanian and Diaspora scientists in 1989. Today, VMU is collaborating with many universities and scientists around the world, carrying out projects, student and employee exchanges, and constantly improving the system of studying and research.

VMU has established double and joint degree international study programmes with European universities, joint module programmes with universities in the United States, and international doctoral and postdoctoral studies, all of which foster student mobility and utilize the multilingual opportunities offered by the university. Since 1999, VMU has been participating in the interuniversity student and teacher exchange programme Erasmus+, which allows VMU students to study abroad. Every year, large groups of international students. and several dozen teachers from various universities around the world, join the VMU community in accordance with international agreements. Meanwhile, VMU students can spend a semester or even a full academic year at universities throughout Europe, the Americas, South Korea, Japan or elsewhere.

Collaborations are determined by bilateral agreements, and ties with other countries are established by joining and participating in international organizations and networks. Various international projects and programmes allow the university to expand its scope internationally.

Every year, Vytautas Magnus University also provides excellent opportunities to take part in various international summer schools, most of which follow in the footsteps of the Lithuanian Language and Culture Summer Courses at VMU. As an example, the course taught at VMU is highly valued by foreign students, who spend four weeks improving their Lithuanian language skills, while getting to know a little about the Lithuanian lifestyle, visiting historical landmarks, and making new friends from around the globe.



Vytautas Magnus University, which, thanks to the joint efforts of Lithuanian and Diaspora scientists, was reestablished more than a quarter-century ago, has become the academic and cultural centre of all Lithuanians around the world: the World Lithuanian University (WLU). With its activities, the WLU improves mutual collaboration and social connections between creators in Lithuania and the Diaspora. It brings together various initiatives by scientists and artists of Lithuania with the rest of the world in order to increase international recognition for joint research projects and to contribute to the spread of Lithuanian language, culture and achievements in arts and the academia all over the globe.

The World Lithuanian University cooperates with Lithuanian/Baltic centres around the world. Aside from fostering and developing relations with Diaspora communities, the WLU also holds seminars, conferences and publishes books on issues of Lithuanian emigration, re-emigration, questions of identity change, and more. Worl Lithuanian University gathers and publishes information on opportunities to promote involvement of young scientists and researchers in the activities of VMU. It also organizes film viewings and exhibitions related to the Diaspora.

WLU provides opportunities for the best students and researchers of Vytautas Magnus University to study and complete internships abroad. The internships are funded by nominal scholarships established by the university's sponsors.

Activities managed by WLU also include a multitude of other scientific and educational projects, such as research on Lithuanian Diaspora heritage, migrantology studies and Lithuanian education.

The World Lithuanian University @ VMU aims to unite World Lithuanians, encourage mutual academic and cultural projects, and nurture the concept of a global Lithuania.

Law programme with Texas Tech University (TTU)

This is a joint programme of intensive lectures for VMU and TTU students, which provides a possibility of externship for TTU students in Lithuanian companies.

The Summer Law Program has been approved by the Accreditation Committee of the ABA Section on Legal Education.

Lithuanian Language and Culture Summer Courses

These courses foster the oldest traditions of all summer courses at the university and is highly valued by foreign students, who spend four weeks improving their Lithuanian language skills, while getting to know a little about the Lithuanian lifestyle, visiting historical landmarks, and making new friends from around the globe.

Learn English in the Baltics

This summer school is designed for students who would like to combine a high quality English language development programme with an intercultural experience. Classroom activities integrate listening, reading, speaking and writing skills at an appropriate level.

Lithuanian International Student Services (LISS) and Summer Internship Program (SIP)

These Programmes offer a practical opportunity for students to gain professional knowledge of their chosen field, learn or improve Lithuanian language skills, get to know the modern Lithuania and participate in professional internships in Lithuania's governmental institutions and private enterprises.

The original inception of Vytautas Magnus University is closely linked to the birth of Lithuanian statehood. Having declared the country's independence in February 1918, the key figures of the Lithuanian enlightenment considered it a high priority to establish a Lithuanian university. Four years later, in 1922, the University of Lithuania opened, as a result of reformation of the Higher Courses, and remained the only Lithuanian school of higher education during the interwar period. Since its beginning, it remained a vitally important hotbed for cultural, scientific and modern national ideas. When the 500th anniversary of the death of Grand Duke Vytautas Magnus was commemorated in 1930, the University of Lithuania was renamed "Vytautas Magnus University" to honour his name and the momentous occasion.

In 1950, almost three decades after its opening, the university was closed down by the Soviet government. Some of the VMU faculties, however, served as a foundation for other schools of higher education: Aleksandras Stulginskis University, Kaunas University of Technology and the Lithuania University of Health Sciences. Thanks to emigrants, the academic tradition of VMU not only survived, but kept developing for a number of years until the restoration of independence. In 1989, the university was re-established through the collective efforts of Lithuanian and emigrant scientists. At the time, it was the only autonomous school of higher education in the country.

The Statute of University legitimized the principle of academic freedom and the unity of science and studies. It also introduced the principle of three level studies, recognized by bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees, which were a novelty in Lithuania at the time. VMU was also separated from its counterparts within the country by its use of a Western studying concept based on the model established by Harvard University. This model, unusual for Lithuania and the region, gives preferences to a wide-spanning, general university education as opposed to narrow and heavily specialized studies. This results in an increased focus on universal, versatile education and the needs of modern society.

the vibrant city of kaunas

Most countries have at least one cosy city which has flourished after giving birth to a university. These cities develop a strong attraction because of their exceptionally creative and youthful academic atmosphere, exuding an aura of intellectuality. In the United Kingdom, Oxford and Cambridge are rare gems of academic spirit; likewise, Italy has Bologna, Poland has Kraków and Estonia has Tartu. Lithuania has Kaunas. Having served as the provisional capital during one of the most important periods of our country's history, Kaunas may also be dubbed the most academic city of Lithuania. Boasting nearly 300 thousand inhabitants, Kaunas is one of the most significant cities of Lithuania. It is situated at the confluence of the Neris and Nemunas rivers, right in the heart of the country. Kaunas is the second largest city in Lithuania, located 100 km away from the capital Vilnius.

Kaunas is an attractive centre of business and industry as well as science, studies and culture. Famous music, dance, and visual art festivals are held in Kaunas. It is famous for its colourful history, peaceful parks, remarkable and wonderful Old Town, and an interwar spirit.

Kaunas remains an important historical and cultural Lithuanian city, known for its active, young and ambitious people. In 1408, Magdeburg rights were granted to the city of Kaunas by the privilege of Vytautas Magnus. In the early 20th century, Kaunas was the home of the Lithuanian Government and the capital of the country; this period is considered by many to be the golden age of the city. However, history tells us that even before this date, the city experienced many other periods of great prosperity and national importance.
