

Kazimieras Simonavičius University

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic year starts on September the 1st of each year and ends on June 30 of the following year. Each year is divided into two semesters. Each semester consists of at least 16 full weeks of classes and two examinations sessions. Teaching starts on September 7 for the autumn semester in 2016 and on February 8 for the spring semester in 2017, which ends on May 27.

METHODS OF ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING ACHIEVEMENTS

Cumulative assessment is applied. It consists of intermediate assignments (colloquia, practical work, individual and team assignments and their presentation, research work, etc.) and evaluation of students' performance at written or oral examination. Examinations are held in January and June. If a student fails an exam, there is a chance to re-sit.

GRADING SYSTEM IN LITHUANIA

The grading scale is based on a number scale from 10 (excellent) to 1 (very poor). Grades 4 and lower are considered a failure. A student who fails an examination is allowed to re-sit it.

Visa and Temporary Residence Permit

EUROPEAN ECONOMIC AREA (EEA)*	Depending on the citizenship and length of stay in Lithuania, one may be able to enter Lithuania without a visa. If you are a national of the European Economic Area (EEA), you do not need a visa to come to Lithuania to study. You will just need your EEA national passport or ID card to enter Lithuania.
NON EUROPEAN ECONOMIC AREA	If you are from outside the EEA then you will need to apply for visa D to study at Kazimieras Simonavičius University. The decision on the issue of visa D is usually made within 10 days after the receipt of application. Visa D allows students to travel via Schengen area countries for 3 months in each period of 6 months. After first semester at Kazimieras Simonavičius University, students will apply for a temporary residence permit.

Where do I apply for visa?	Your application should be submitted to the Embassy/Consulate of the Republic of Lithuania. In countries where Lithuania does not have an Embassy, there is often another EU member state that represents Lithuania and where an application can be submitted

When lodging the application, the applicant shall: (a) present an application form; (b) present a travel document; (c) present a photograph in accordance with the standards set out in Regulation (EC) No 1683/95 or, where the VIS is operational pursuant to Article 48 of the VIS Regulation; (e) pay the visa fee; (f) provide supporting documents; (g) where applicable, produce proof of possession of adequate and valid travel medical insurance.

TEMPORARY RESIDENCE PERMIT

After the first semester at Kazimieras Simonavičius University, degree students from outside EU/EEA countries will apply for a temporary residence permit. You have to renew your residence permit each year. It is advisable to start the renewal process in time because it takes several months before being completed.

LEGALISATION OF THE EDUCATIONAL DOCUMENTS

Legalisation of the educational documents is an important issue. We do not accept your education or study documents without Apostille or Consular Legislation. Therefore, we kindly ask you to check the information on the website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs, section <u>LEGALISATION</u>.

Applicants who received their education in countries acceding to the Hague 1961 Convention (e.g. Israel, Italy, United Kingdom, Russian Federation, Ukraine, Kazakhstan, etc.) should have an attached "Apostille" to their educational documents. In most countries legalisation services (the "Apostille" is issued) are provided at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or the Ministry of Education.

Applicants who received their education in any other country (Lebanon, Jordan, Syria, Uzbekistan, Kirghizstan, Moldavia, etc.) should pass a double legalisation of their educational documents. First of all, the education or study documents should be legalised by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs where education was received. Afterwards, the documents should be legalised by the Lithuanian diplomatic mission or consular post in the country where education was received or in the Consular Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Lithuania.



HOW TO BECOME AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT AT KSU

- 1. Apply to the Lithuanian Centre for Quality Assessment in Higher Education(CQAHA) for your school transcript and diploma evaluation (it could take up to 1-1,5 month to get approval from CQAHA);
- 2. Submit application documents to KSU:
 - 1) A copy of secondary education or high education diploma;
 - 2) Application Form;
 - 3) Two passport size photos;
 - 4) A copy of your passport or ID card;
 - 5) A motivation letter;
 - 6) A Curriculum Vitae.
- 3. Have a conversation with KSU enrolment committee (on skype conference, 40-60 min., in English);
- 4. If accepted to University, make application fee and tuition fee payment;
- 5. Sign study agreement;

6. Apply for Visa (Depending on the citizenship and length of stay in Lithuania, one may be able to enter Lithuania without a Visa. Please check Visa requirements at the closest Lithuanian Embassy before arrival or on internet site of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, VISAS).

NOTE

- All documents must be translated into the Lithuanian or the English language;
- Only applicants who have submitted all the required documents will be considered for acceptance to the university.
- Your documents cannot be admitted without Apostille or Consular Legalisation. (depending on your country of origin)!!! For more information please check <u>LEGALISATION</u>.
- Application documents must be sent by post addressed to Kazimieras Simonavicius University, International Admissions, J. Basanaviciaus st. 29A, LT-03109 Vilnius, Lithuania.

Buddy Programme in KSU

The main purpose of this programme is to assist international students in their integration into the Lithuanian life and to complete their study period successfully. International students can find support from the very beginning of their exchange period from one of the KSU mentor students, who will help them to find their way through, before and during their stay in Vilnius.

A buddy can give advice on everyday issues such as shopping or mobile phone and provide you with tips on how to spend the spare time. Over the course of the semester, international students can turn to buddy whenever they have a question.

We believe this initiative helps both local and international students to become culturally, academically and linguistically integrated with each other.

Please, do not forget that buddies do their work as volunteers. Therefore, students cannot demand any assistance that exceeds their competence as a helping contact person.

Orientation Day at KSU

The International Relations Office organizes Orientation Day every year to introduce new international students to Vilnius and to the Lithuanian university system. During the day, we offer a number of events and presentations covering various academic and social subjects. We strongly recommend you take part in it.

Orientation Day takes place in the week before lectures start. During this time, incoming students are shown around the university by buddy students. It is an excellent opportunity to meet other students and to start adapting to everyday life in KSU.

The programme for the Orientation Day is usually posted both on the Facebook page (a member of the International Relations Office will invite incoming students to join the private KSU page), and in the KSU official website, shortly before the start of the semester.

How to reach Kazimieras Simonavičius University?

There are good transport connections practically with all European countries. You can get to Vilnius by plane, by train, by coach or by car. Ferries are available from Germany, Sweden and Denmark to Klaipėda from where you can continue by coach to Vilnius.

Students are supposed to arrive one or two days before the beginning of studies. This will give the time to settle in and get acquainted with the city before starting classes.

Once you arrive at the airport in Vilnius, you may take a taxi to the university for about 20 euros (if you call the taxi in advance, it will cost about 4 euros), or you may take the direct bus number 3G for 1 euro. Bus number 3G leaves just in front of the arrival terminal of the airport from the bus stop ORO UOSTAS (Airport). You will have 4 stops between the Airport and the university. You have to get off on the fifth bus stop named MIKALOJAUS KOSTANTINO CIURLIONIO. From the bus stop, it is a very short and walking distance to Kazimieras Simonavičius University. The International Relations Office is located on the 4th floor at the left hand side.

Life in Vilnius

Very pleasant and very beautiful, that is what comes to one's mind when talking about Vilnius. The city displays a variety of both architectural expression and willpower. This is perhaps due to the interesting history that rests in this attractive town, which not always has been the capital of Lithuania. However, for over five centuries, until the 18th century, Vilnius has been the political and cultural centre of Grand Duchy of Lithuania. The Old Town in Vilnius was included in the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1994 because the town "has preserved an impressive complex of Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque and classical buildings as well as its medieval layout and natural setting".

It is unlikely that you will ever be bored in Vilnius. Despite its relatively small size, Vilnius offers an astonishing array of cultural activities, including numerous galleries and museums, like the National Gallery and the Contemporary Art Center; theatres, including a Russian Theatre; symphony and chamber orchestras; music clubs and night clubs; street fairs and art walks, cinema, and so on.

Though European cuisine predominates in Vilnius, you will find food from all over the world here in all manner of coffee-shops, restaurants, inns, pizzerias, grill-bars, kebab houses, wineries, and pubs.

Shopping centers and supermarkets abound and almost all of the products and services available in any European capital are available here. The largest shopping centers Akropolis and Ozas are located outside the city center.

Numerous recreational opportunities exist in and around Vilnius. Lithuania is particularly known for its lakes. The Green Lakes (Žalieji ežerai) are the closest to Vilnius and easily accessible.

Trakai, one-time capital of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania, with its medieval castle and pristine lakes is within a 30-minute drive. Buses and trains can take you there for a tour of the castle, boating, swimming, and other recreational activities.

10 Cultural Highlights of Vilnius

Vilnius Cathedral

The Vilnius Cathedral is not only one of the most beautiful architectural masterpieces of classicism style in the Capital of Lithuania, it is also a significant historic heritage that looks like keeping the secret of those who were in furtherance of the Cathedral to stand in the heart of Vilnius.

Gediminas Castle

Gediminas Castle, built approximately in 1230, is one of the most famous castles of Lithuania. Its main tower is a symbol of Vilnius and Lithuania and it is an essential part of any tour around Vilnius.

Gate of Dawn

The Gate of Dawn is one of the greatest highlights in Vilnius. This miracle and religious place attracts people from all over the world.

Vilnius University

Vilnius University is not only the oldest university in Lithuania; it is also one of the oldest in Europe. The university, located in the Old Town, is famous for the education quality, for its interesting history and the marvellous appearance of the Old ensemble of Vilnius University.

St. Anne's Church

St. Anne's Church is a church which will definitely leave an impression, maybe the same as it once left to Napoleon Bonaparte himself, who wanted to take it to Paris with him in the palm of his own hand if it were ever possible.



Vilnius Town Hall

Vilnius Town Hall designed by Laurynas Stuoka-Gucevičius for many years has been and continues to be one of the main hubs of trading, festivities, celebrations and other culture events in Vilnius.

The Bastion of Vilnius Defence Wall

The Bastion of Vilnius defensive wall is a very picturesque place in the Vilnius Old Town which keeps many historical secrets. Visiting it may reveal some of them thus the ambivalent atmosphere still will not be dispelled...

Vilnius TV Tower

Vilnius TV Tower is the highest building in Lithuania. At the height of 165 meters there is a restaurant called "Paukščių takas" ("Milky Way"). Visiting it for a dinner and a great panoramic view is a must for everyone staying in Vilnius.

The Park of Europe

The Park of Europe is a very surprising open air museum located in the city of Vilnius. Visitors are always persuaded that the European art can be extremely original.

National Museum of Lithuania

National Museum of Lithuania is one of the most important and oldest museums in Lithuania. It contains thousands of different exhibits and over 250 000 people visit the museum every year.

ACCOMMODATION - KSU Student House

KSU offers an apartment for rent in Vilnius (a dorm-style apartment for rent), a convenient transportation, and 4 minutes walk to the Old Town and the station, you can arrange your furniture in a room as you wish or bring your own furniture. This is a place for local students as well as foreign students.

The rent price includes all utilities, wireless internet, and general cleaning of joint rooms.

Other advantages:

Other benefits include an indoor night locked courtyard (each room will have the key), next there is a company that supplies food to schools and kindergartens, so you can order breakfast, lunch or dinner for +/- 4-5 Euros. A bathhouse with a recreation room would also be available with an additional fee. Joint rooms: A corridor, kitchen, 2 showers, 2 toilets, a washing machine.

Transportation

The public transportation system in Vilnius consists of buses and trolleybuses. Tickets in Vilnius transport system are presented as electronic tickets limited by time (30, 60 minutes) and single tickets. Full prices for electronic time limited tickets for 30 or 60 minutes cost (0,60 euro and 0,90 euro respectively). A single ticket for a trolleybus or bus, if purchased in a vehicle, costs 1 euro. Students can purchase tickets at a discount only after obtaining students ID card. The single ticket price with a discount for students is 0,50 euro if bought on the bus. A monthly electronic ticket with a discount for students costs 5,79 Euro (for both bus and trolleybus). Students who hold an ISIC card are eligible for discounted public transportation tickets. Public transportation starts working at 5 a.m. and runs until 11 p.m.

Taxis can be booked on the <u>Etaksi</u> page, by using the Apps eTAKSI or <u>Taxify</u>. There you will find a list of companies that provide taxi services in Vilnius.

Rail links are fairly good between Vilnius and Minsk, covering the approximately 170 kilometers distance in about three hours. The train can take you from Vilnius to Kaunas in about one hour. Information about rail service and schedules are available <u>here</u>.

<u>Vilnius International Airport</u> offers flights to many European capitals, with connections to most any part of the world.

KSU Students' Union

Once you are studying in Vilnius, a healthy social life will undoubtedly enhance your stay. Social contacts are very important, especially for exchange students who arrive in a new country with a different culture. The student culture together with the different education culture makes a period of study abroad worthwhile. Telephone and Useful Numbers

In Lithuania, area codes consist of 2 digits for the towns with 6-digit numbering. Smaller towns have a 3-digit area code and 5-digit phone number, Vilnius has 7-digit number and single digit city code. Total national number's length is always 8 digits.

To make an international call, first dial 8-10 OR 00, then dial the country (and city) code and then the telephone number. Usually all country codes are listed in the telephone boots or may be consulted by calling 117 (free of charge telecom customer service) or 118 (information telephone at 0,43 EUR/min. Pay-phone cards (in Lithuanian telefono kortelė) may be purchased in all press kiosks, shopping centers or supermarkets.

Mobile communications are provided by the three major operators in Lithuania which are Omnitel, Bite GSM, and Tele2. All international students may get services under the same conditions as regular local students (usually with special student discounts). Prepaid mobile telephone cards (EXTRA from Omnitel, LABAS from Bite GSM, PILDYK from Tele2) ease communication both within Lithuania and international student home country.
