

# VILNIUS, LITHUANIA

Vilnius, as the capital of Lithuania, is the home of the President, the Seimas, the Government and the Supreme Court. Diplomatic missions, educational, cultural, financial, research, and healthcare institutions are based here.


Vilnius (vil-nyus), the baroque beauty of the Baltic, is a city of immense allure. It easily tops the country's best-attraction bill, drawing tourists like moths to a flame with an easy, confident charm and a warm, golden glow that makes you wish for long midsummer evenings every day of the year.

The capital may be a long way north and east, but it's quintessentially continental, with Europe's largest baroque old town at its heart. Viewed from a hot air balloon, the skyline – pierced by countless Orthodox and Catholic church steeples – looks like a giant bed of nails. Adding to this heady mix is a combination of cobbled alleys, crumbling corners, majestic hilltop views, breakaway states and traditional artists' workshops – all in a city so small you'd sometimes think it was a village.

It has not always been so happy here, though. There are reminders of loss and pain too, from the horror of the KGB's torture cells to the ghettos where the Jewish community was concentrated before being murdered by the Nazis. Yet the spirit of freedom and resistance has prevailed, and the city is forging a new identity, combining the past with a present and future that involves world cuisine, a burgeoning nightlife and shiny new skyscrapers.

Mykolas Romeris University (MRU) is an international university located in Vilnius and Kaunas, Lithuania. Modern, creative and entrepreneurial academic community has raised MRU to the leading university in social sciences and interdisciplinary research in Lithuania. MRU cooperates closely with over 300 universities, public and private institutions, takes part in academic, professional and inter-sectorial networks. MRU has a full membership of the following international higher education organizations: International Association of Universities, European University Association, European Association for International Education, European-Asian Knowledge Consortium Social Technologies for Smart and Inclusive Society, etc.

Currently MRU enrolls over 15,000 students and employs over 700 academic staff. The university offers more than 100 doctoral, master and bachelor study programmes, over 80% of them have international accreditation. The most popular study programmes are law, management, public administration, psychology, social work, public security, etc. About 200 doctoral students study in the fields of law, management, psychology, philology, economics, and educational science.




## Application Times

Please note that you have to apply to the exchange programme in your current year by 20 December. Applications for the host university must be submitted between April and May or September and October (depending on the Trimester), in the year following your initial application.

# ACCOMMODATION & LIVING



Mykolas Romeris University offers accommodation for international students on campus – at student residence hall "Student house"– the twelve floor modern building. It takes 5 minutes on foot to come to the main University building.

Due to the increasing number of students, only places in shared rooms are offered. Rooms are shared by two or three students. Monthly rent of a place in a room in the "Student house" is from €85 to €100. International exchange students are required to pay for the accommodation in advance for the entire semester upon arrival.

## Living Costs

The average cost of living including housing (sharing flat), food, local bus.metro transportation and medical insurance is about €350 - €450 per month. The actual costs will vary depending on your lifestyle.

**Rent** €85 - €100

**Food** €150 - €200/per month

**Public transport ticket** €6,50 (student monthly e-ticket)

**Other costs** €50 - €100/per month

**Leisure** €60 - 170€

## Transport

Most of the buses and trolleybuses start running at around 5:00 in the morning. To catch up with the [public transport](#) check the [timetables](#) at the bus stops.

To get to the centre of the city or to the train station from the University you should take buses No 10, 34, 53 or 2G. No 34, 53 and 2G will take you directly to the Bus (Train) station, but if you want to go to the centre, take a bus No 10 and get off straight in front of the Cathedral Square – the heart of the city.

Your way back to the University is quite the opposite. You can also start off or finish your journey at IKI (Engl. "see you!") supermarket – it is a short way from the University „Student House". The public transport system in Vilnius consists of the trolleybus, bus and express bus network. They start running at 5 in the morning and stop at midnight.





