The Country

<u>Portugal</u> is a unitary semi-presidential republic. It is located in South-Western Europe, on the Iberian Peninsula, and it is the westernmost country of mainland Europe, being bordered by the Atlantic Ocean to the west and south and by Spain to the

north and east. Portugal is considered a developed country with an advanced economy and high living standards, listed with the nineteen the quality of life index rating in the world as of 2005. It's one of the world's most globalized and peaceful nations and is among the 20 most visited countries in the world. According to the 2011 Census, 81.0% of the Portuguese population is Roman Catholic.



The City

Lisbon is the westernmost large city located in Europe and the only one along the Atlantic coast, with a population of 547,631 within its administrative limits. It lies in the western Iberian Peninsula on the Atlantic Ocean and the River Tagus. The typical summer season lasts about six months, from May to October. Alcântara and Barrio Alto are areas in Lisbon very attractive to youth because of the number of pubs and discothèques. Torre de Belem is the most famous tower in Lisbon, built as afortified lighthouse to guard the entrance to the port. Other major historical building are the Mosteiro dos Jerónimos and Padrão dos Descobrimentos. Parque das Nações is



pedestrian-friendly area with new buildings, restaurants, gardens, the Casino Lisbon, the FIL building (International Exhibition and Fair), the Camões Theatre, as well as the *Oceanário de Lisboa* (Lisbon Oceanarium), the second largest in the world.

Student Life

Studying at Nova SBE is an enriching experience that goes far beyond the classroom.
