Swiss students are defined as students with Swiss nationality and foreign students residing in Switzerland at the time of completing their secondary education, or students whose parents or spouse are Swiss residents. This category also includes students whose parents belong to diplomatic missions or international organisations with their headquarters or offices in Switzerland.

Foreign students are defined as students of foreign nationality whose parents reside outside Switzerland.

Deadlines for payment

- 30 September for the Fall semester
- 28 February for the Spring semester

Application fee

There is no administrative fee for holders of Swiss academic qualifications.

A fee of CHF 100.- is charged for an application made on the basis of a foreign diploma. This amount is deducted from the first semester tuition fees for students admitted to UniNE.

Scholarships and financial aid

Insurance

AVS/AI/APG

The AVS is the main element of Swiss social security.

- AVS: Swiss old age and survivors insurance
- AI: disability insurance
- APG: unemployment insurance

Swiss and foreign students living in Switzerland pay CHF 480.- (+ 20.- administrative fees) per year in social security contributions starting on 1 January of the first year following their 20th birthday.

Students who are gainfully employed pay contributions from the 1st of January in the year following their 17th birthday.

Schools and universities submit lists of their students to the Neuchâtel Cantonal Compensation Office once a year. Using this information, the Compensation Office then issues an annual bill for the contributions due. The Cantonal compensation office which is authorized to affiliate the students has jurisdiction in their place of study.

You are exempt from contributions:

- If you can prove that you have paid at least CHF 480.- in contributions during the year in question.
- If you are in Switzerland for the sole purpose of studying and do not have resident status (you are in Switzerland on a student permit).
- If your spouse contributes to Swiss social security and has paid at least twice the amount (CHF 960.-) of the minimum contribution due on earnings, as defined by the AVS.

Students who have paid less than CHF 480.- (minimum contribution) on their earnings for the year in question only have to pay the difference.

Health and accident insurance

All regular students enrolled at UniNE must take out basic illness and accident insurance from a Swiss health insurance plan recognized under the Swiss Health Insurance Law (LAMaL). As you are free to choose between the different plans, it is in your best interest to compare the different premiums and benefits, for example at www.priminfo.ch

Students whose earnings do not exceed a certain amount (which varies according to the Canton and their personal situation) may be entitled to a reduction in their premium. Requests for a reduction must be made to the competent authority in the Canton of residence.

Please note : if you take up residence in the Canton of Neuchâtel, this insurance must be acquired from the Resident Registration Office of your “commune” within the first three months following your registration.

Coordinating studies with military service

There are provisions for coordinating military obligations with university studies. The Enrolment Office (BIM) acts as a liaison. Training at the Swiss Army school of recruits can be completed between the ages of 18 and 23 and training for noncommissioned officers and officers from ages 19 to 24, or even 25 if the request for deferral is justified.

All requests for deferment of military service must be accompanied by:

- a deferral request form (available at the BIM)
- a copy of the examination registration application, duly stamped by the relevant Faculty

Study Exchange Office

During your studies, you have the possibility of attending another university for one or two semesters in order to take courses which, in terms of content and/or workload, will replace all or part of those you would have attended had you remained at UniNE. During the exchange, you remain enrolled at the University of Neuchâtel but are exempt from course and laboratory fees as well as taxes and tuition fees at the partner establishment. The exchange is carried out within the framework of an exchange programme or convention.

Studying abroad

Special conventions allow you to study within Europe under the Swiss-European Mobility Programme, in Quebec under CREPUQ, or even in the United States, South America, Australia or Russia.

You can grasp this opportunity after having studied for at least two semesters at UniNE. Each Faculty has fixed study exchange slots (the most favourable periods for an exchange within its curriculum) which are selected for you to get the most out of your stay.

Studying at another Swiss university

The University of Neuchâtel is party to several conventions which allow students to either choose courses in other universities (BeNeFri

and Triangle Azur) or to study there for one or two semesters (Swiss mobility), starting from your third semester.

- The **Triangle Azur**, which consists of the universities of Neuchâtel, Lausanne and Geneva, is a university network which allows students to take a subject in another university if it is not offered in their own. Second-class train tickets are reimbursed.
- The university network **BeNeFri** combines the universities of Bern, Neuchâtel and Fribourg. It offers students enrolled in one of these universities the possibility to study in either of the two others and take examinations there. The exchanges are limited to fields of study which are covered by a convention. Second-class train tickets are reimbursed, as well as a portion of the half-price season ticket.
- A class somewhere else? You can also choose a course in another Swiss university which is not a part of the University of Neuchâtel network.

International students

Visa and residence permit

Different visa and residence permit regulations are applicable depending on the student country of origin.

Students from non-EU countries must have a study visa issued by a Swiss embassy or consulate. The visa must be requested from a diplomatic or consular representative abroad, several months prior to starting your studies in Switzerland. In order to obtain the study visa, you must present a valid passport, an enrolment certificate from the University of Neuchâtel as well as proof of sufficient financial means to study in Switzerland. Foreign students are strongly recommended to apply for a study visa rather than travel to Switzerland on a tourist visa.

Students from EU countries must register with their “commune” Resident Registration Office within 14 days of arrival in Switzerland and are required to apply for a residence permit.

Illness and accident insurance

It is obligatory for everyone living in Switzerland, including foreign students, to have and contribute to a basic illness and accident insurance. This insurance must be acquired within the first three months following your registration with the Resident Registration Office in your “commune” of residence.

A foreign student may receive dispensation from this obligation if he can certify that he is covered by insurance offering the same benefits elsewhere. Please note, however, that the conditions for exemption are very restrictive.

Employment

Because learning is the main purpose of university studies, part-time employment is allowed, but only up to a maximum of 15 hours a week. Any gainful employment is subject to an application procedure which can be either: a request by the employer for foreign labour or, depending on the case, simple registration with the competent cantonal authority.

Capucine card

*Your student
passport!*

Issued upon your enrolment at UniNE, the Capucine card has several functions:

- student card (proof of enrolment, required for sitting examinations)
- card for making photocopies and printing (200 black and white copies or 20 coloured copies offered free of charge every year)
- library lending card
- access card into certain buildings on the UniNE campus
- proof of payment for access to fitness centres

The Capucine Card functions on the Capucine terminals situated in the various Faculty buildings. These terminals allow you to consult and update your personal data, check the balance and re-charge your card with up to CHF 60. You can also recharge your card using a credit card at www.unine.ch/chargementcapucine

User and email accounts

The University of Neuchâtel offers staff and students a computer network with a variety of services:

- a personal user account
- a personal email account (each student receives a personal mailbox and email address, for example: name.surname@unine.ch. The size of the mailbox is limited to 2GB. Messages are limited to a maximum of 20 MB.)
- personal data storage space (M :), access to a common student storage space (N :) and temporary storage (T :). These drives are valid only on UniNE computers.

Web access & WiFi

On campus

Unrestricted internet access is available across the entire UniNE campus free of charge.

- The WiFi network unine is for students, UniNE staff and University partners.
- 37 Internet terminals are available on the UniNE campus.
- 7 computer rooms equipped with the most commonly used software programmes are also available.

Off campus

You can access UniNE IT resources (including your files) from anywhere around the world: the site (webaccess.unine.ch) gives you remote secure access to UniNE servers.

UniNE is a part of the Public Wireless LAN (PWLAN) network. This network gives students free access to all the commercial Internet Hotspots of Monsoon Networks, TheNet-Internet Services AG and Swisscom, a total of around 1,700 Hotspots spread across all Switzerland. In practical terms, this means that as soon as a student is connected to the WiFi terminal of one of its service providers, he can connect directly to all UniNE resources by using VPN Client (Virtual Private Network software provided by SITEL), and from there access the Internet via the University network.





IT services and facilities

Software

Two types of software licences are available to students:

- site licence : software requiring a site licence is available to all students, who may install them on their personal computers.
- network licence : students may install these on their personal computers as long as they are connected to the UniNE network

Microsoft software

Anti-plagiarism

Compilatio.net makes it possible to identify potential plagiarism in digital documents which contain text. This allows you to verify the originality of your texts before handing them in to your teachers. The software interface is available in French, German, English, Italian and Spanish. When analysing documents, all languages using the Latin alphabet are taken into account.
